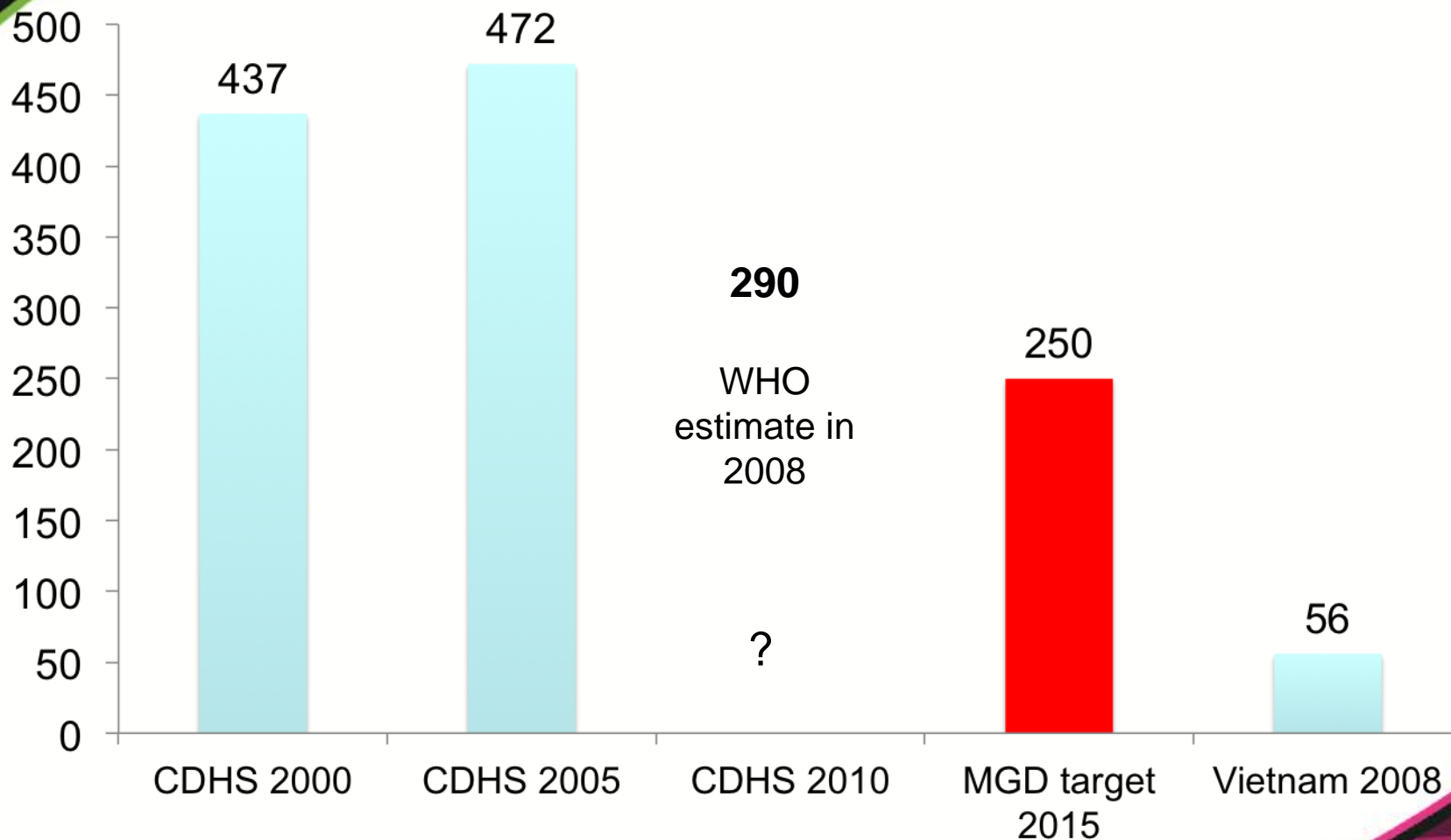

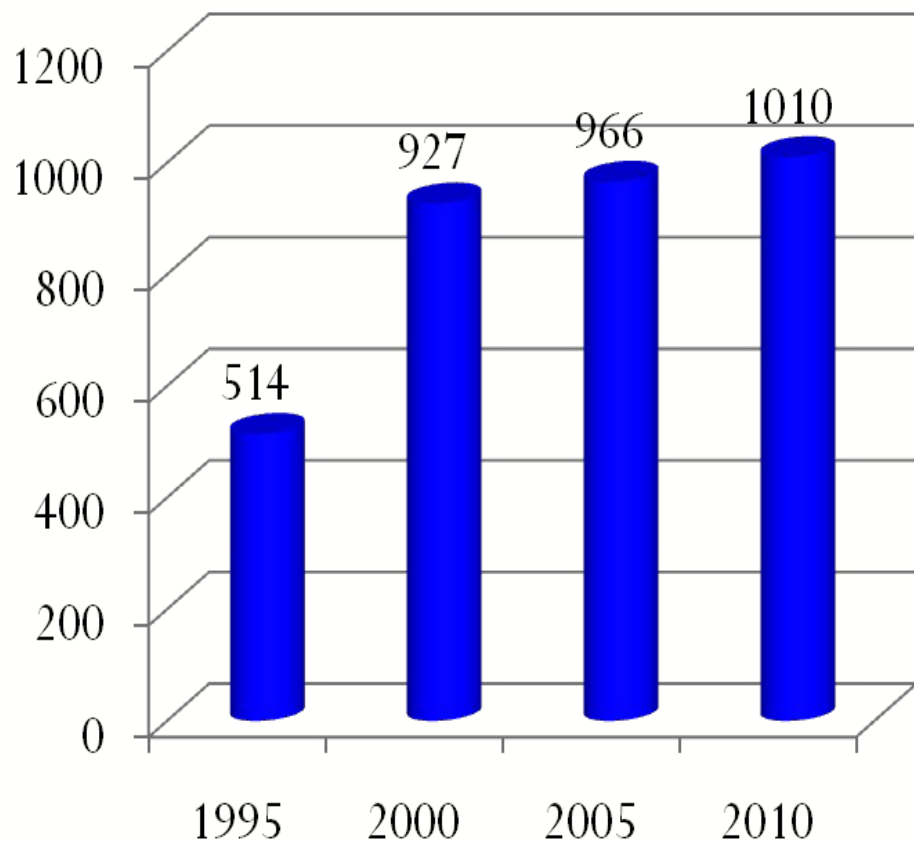

Maternal Mortality Rate per 100,000

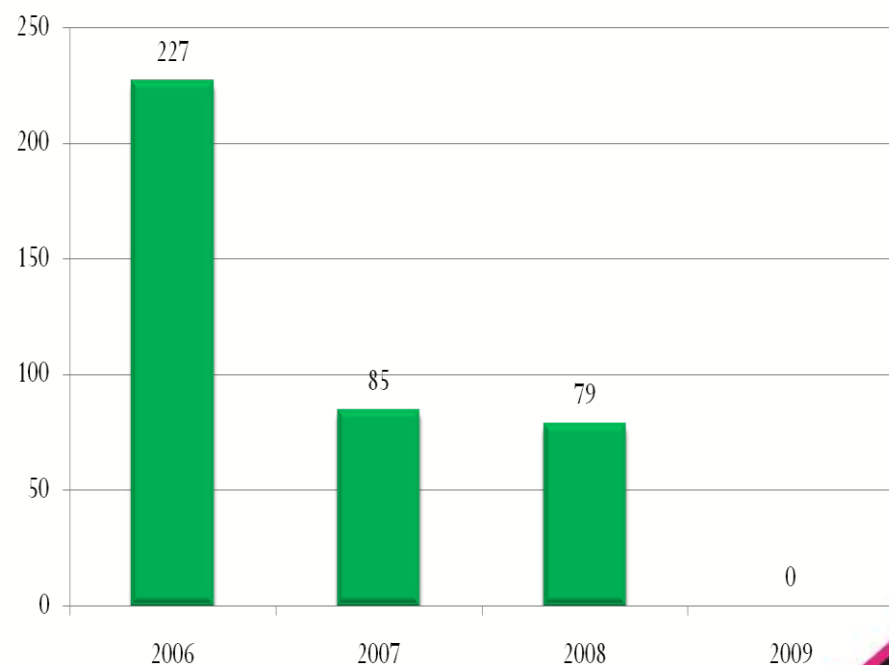

No of Health Centers

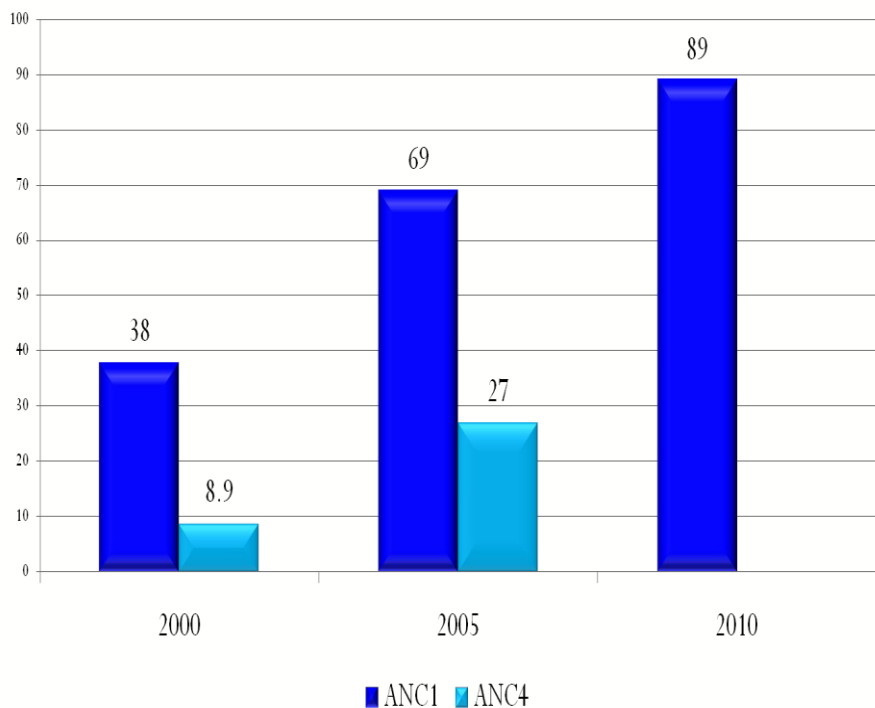


Number of Health Centers without Midwife

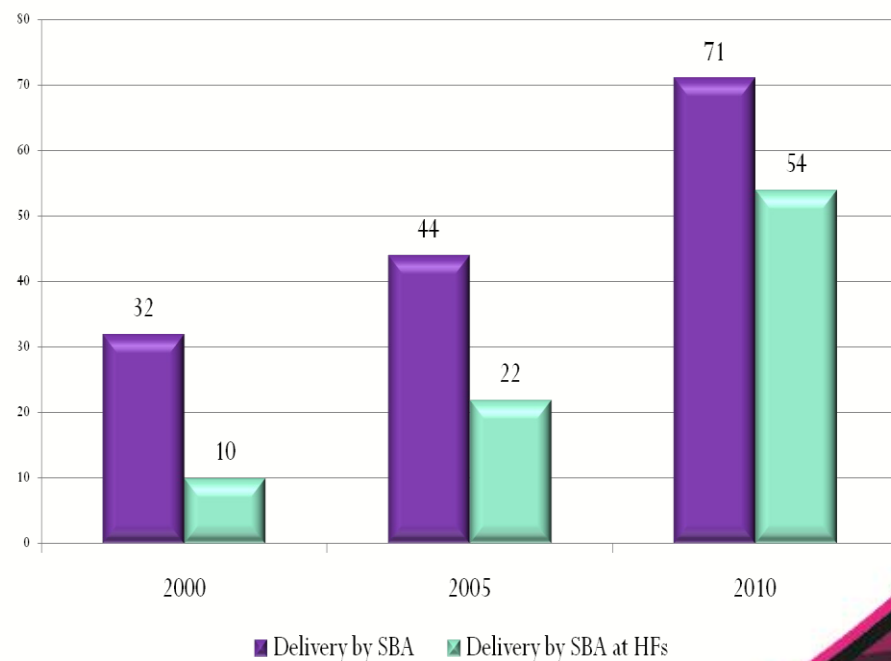

Responses: National Targets by 2015

1. Increased number of health facilities provide Basic and Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric & Newborn care from 44 to 174
1. Increased Antenatal Care Coverage (at least 2) to 90%
2. Increased percentage of deliveries attended by Skilled Birth Attendants at health facilities to 70%
3. Increased Post-natal Care Coverage to 50%
4. Increased Contraceptive Prevalence to 60%
5. Increased access to reproductive, maternal and newborn health by removing financial barrier and ensure that 95% of the poor is covered by Health Equity Fund
6. Improved health seeking behavior among individuals, family and community

Roles of NIPH related to Maternal Health

- Health care system strengthening
 - Human resource development and management
 - Quality improvement
- Training & research in nutrition
 - Capacity building in the areas of nutrition
- Other scope of work at NIPH:
 - Non communicable diseases (Hypertension and other chronic diseases)
 - Occupational & Environmental health (global warming & health impact, insecticide...)
